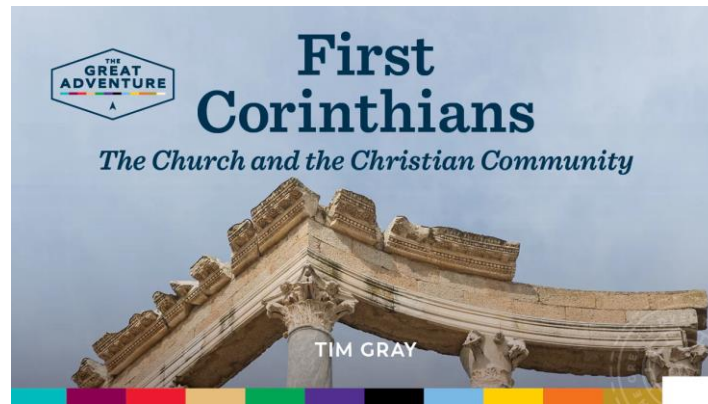

## How Do I Live as a Christian in a Pagan Culture?

St. Paul's first letter to the Corinthians addresses many of the same issues we have today: scandals, promiscuity, debates, controversies, and prosperity versus poverty. The struggles faced by the early Christians in many ways are similar to our own. His message about divisions, immorality, persecution, and other trials, offers wisdom for our own times.

This eleven-part Bible study, *First Corinthians: The Church and the Christian Community* explores St. Paul's advice for living an authentic Christian life in the midst of a pagan culture, and teaches us about the nature of grace, the Church as the body of Christ, and most importantly the Eucharist!
